## Parking and Volunteer Check-In Information

**Parking for Volunteers-** When arriving at Fishermen's Terminal (1900 West Nickerson St.), look for the Volunteer Parking signs that will direct you to the area across the street from the entrance to Fishermen's Terminal in the BNSF (railroad depot) lot. If this lot is full, there is additional parking available by the Terminal just off of W Emerson Pl. You get there by taking the next right on 21<sup>st</sup> where parking is available along the street. If you don't find space there, look for any available 8-hour parking spaces. (We want to allow as much parking as possible inside the terminal for festival guests). It can be difficult to find parking at times, so please allow for some extra time before your shift is scheduled to begin.

**Crossing the Street:** When parking at BNSF (railroad depot), please use the marked pedestrian crosswalk to cross the street to Fishermen's Terminal. The crosswalk is controlled by a Walk/Don't Walk control. The street has high traffic volumes and use of the crosswalk is required. Do not attempt to cross the street except within the marked crosswalk.

**Check in-** Upon arrival, please go to the Information/Volunteer Booth located next to the Memorial Statue in the center of the Terminal along the water side. Volunteer pre-registration is required and your name will be on the volunteer list (under last name). You'll be given a specific assignment and location as well as a festival t-shirt to wear and your meal ticket.

Sometimes it can be too busy to take a break during your shift. We recommend that you come early or plan on staying late to enjoy the festival and food. Reminder that the festival concludes at 6pm.

Please stay in your assigned areas. If there are too many volunteers in one area, you may be re-assigned to another area that is short on volunteers. If this happens to be the case, please check with the head of your booth about heading to the Information/Volunteer booth for potential re-location.

For Community Service hours, any Committee member can sign a form that you bring with you, or bring your forms to the Volunteer/Info booth and a member of the committee can fill out and sign for you there. Forms will only be signed upon shift completion.

If festival attendees inquire about a Lost and Found location, please direct them to the Volunteer/info Booth.

Please remember to bring appropriate clothing and sunscreen for the day's weather conditions.
